

BY-LAW NUMBER 2015-33

BEING A BY-LAW TO REGULATE THE USE OF OFF ROAD VEHICLES ON MUNICIPAL HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF NAIRN AND HYMAN

WHEREAS the *Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, Section 191.8 (1) Chapter H.8* as amended, states that no person shall drive an off-road vehicle on a highway except in accordance with the regulations and any applicable municipal by-laws; and

WHEREAS Section 191.8 (3) of the *Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter H.8* as amended, provides that the Council of a municipality may pass by-laws permitting the operation of off-road vehicles on any highway within the municipality that is under the jurisdiction of the municipality or on any part or parts of such highways and which by-laws may prescribe a lower rate of speed for off-road vehicles by regulations on any highway within the municipality that is under its jurisdiction, or any part or parts of such highway; and

WHEREAS Section 4 (2) of Ontario Regulation 316/03 states that all-terrain vehicles, multi-purpose off-highway utility vehicles and recreational off-highway vehicles may be driven on a highway if the requirements of Part III are met;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Township of Nairn and Hyman hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. Definitions in this By-law:
 - "All-terrain vehicle" means an off road vehicle that:
 - a) has four or more wheels, the tires of which are all in contact with the ground;
 - b) has steering handlebars;
 - c) has a seat that is designed to be straddled by the driver, and
 - d) is designed to carry;
 - a. a driver only and no passengers, or
 - b. a driver and only one passenger, if the vehicle,
 - has one passenger seat that is designed to be straddled by the passenger while sitting facing forward behind the driver, and
 - ii. is equipped with foot rests for the passenger that is separate from the foot rests for the driver.

"Multi-purpose off-highway utility vehicle" means an off-road vehicle that;

- a) has four or more wheels, the tires of which are all in contact with the ground;
- b) has a steering wheel for steering control;
- c) has seats that are not designed to be straddled; and
- d) has a minimum cargo capacity of 159 kilograms.

"Recreational off-highway vehicle" means an off-road vehicle that:

- has four or more wheels, the tires of which are all in contact with the ground;
- b) has a steering wheel for steering control;
- c) has seats that are not designed to be straddled; and

d) has an engine displacement equal to or less that 1,000 cubic centimetres.

"Street, Highway and Laneway" means a highway defined in the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. 1990.

2. Maximum Speed:

No person shall drive an off-road vehicle upon, or across municipal streets and /or highways at a speed exceeding:

- 2.1 twenty (20) kilometers per hour if the speed limit established under the Act for that part of the highway is not greater than fifty (50) kilometers per hour, or
- 2.2 fifty (50) kilometers per hour, if the speed limit established under the Act for that part of the highway is greater than fifty (50) kilometers per hour, O. Reg. 316/03, s.22.
- 3. No person shall operate an off-road vehicle:
 - 3.1 Over or upon the following areas (except for parking in a parking lot) namely:
 - 3.1.1 Nairn Centre Ballfield.
 - 3.1.2 Nairn Community Centre.
 - 3.1.3 Nairn and Hyman All Sport Centre.
 - 3.1.4 Township of Nairn and Hyman Municipal Garage Lot.
 - 3.1.5 All Municipal Fire Halls.
 - 3.1.6 All municipal Parks, Beaches and Playgrounds.
 - 3.1.7 On any sidewalks within the Township of Nairn and Hyman.
- 4. The operator of an off-road vehicle shall ensure:
 - 4.1 That when towing a sleigh or other trailing device, that the said sleigh and/or travelling device shall be equipped with a rigid hitch and shall be fastened securely to the vehicle.
 - 4.2 That all sleighs and/or trailing devices shall be equipped with at least one 7.5 cm red reflector at the rear.
- 5. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine as provided for in the *Provincial Offences Act*.
- 6. By-law number 2004-6 is hereby repealed.
