

CLERK'S REPORT re: MUNICIPAL ELECTION FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Municipal Elections Act requires all candidates to file financial statements following each Municipal Elections and make them available to the public once they are submitted to the Municipal Clerk. The last date for candidates to file financial statements without penalty was March 31, 2023 at 2:00pm.

Candidates who miss the filing deadline can submit their statement up to 30 days later, provided that they pay a \$500 late filing fee. The grace period for the initial financial statement filing ends at 2:00pm on May 1, 2023. Candidates who file in the grace period will not be reimbursed their nomination fee.

CANDIDATES IN DEFAULT:

Below is a list of candidates from the 2022 election who are in default of the Municipal Elections Act, 1996 because they did not file their financial statement (either at all, or on time) or exceeded the expense limit in the 2022 municipal election.

The Municipal Elections Act, 1996 states that until the next regular election has taken place, the candidate is ineligible to be elected or appointed to any office to which this Act applies. If elected to a Council or Board, a candidate in Default shall forfeit their seat.
